A Way Forward

A study prepared for Church Council in 2017 shows the church's financial income and worship attendance has steadily declined since 2006; and without changes, will continue to decline and ultimately lead to cuts to church ministry. In October 2017, the Council established the "A Way Forward" (AWF) team to research trends, options, solutions, and make recommendations for action.

Team Members: Laura Ford (Chair), Karen Dowsett, Marcia Judickas, Larry McCallum, Amy Roehrs, Eric Sandberg, Patty Tillman, Russ Zeskey, Pastor Larry (ad-hoc)

Laura presented a progress report at the congregational meeting held on February 11. Her key points included:

- In 2016, 23% of offerings received were from members age 80+. 2% (less than \$11 thousand) were from members under age 40. The average age of givers was 67. 74% of givers were 60+.
- Based on historical trends, new revenue, or expense reductions, of \$25,000 will be required in each future year. By 2026, average worship attendance may drop to 120, down from 2016 (205) and 2017 (193).
- The team envisions a vibrant future where Trinity has engaged membership; active attendance; a strong sense of community; ministries attractive to younger members and families with children; and activities that are interesting, fun, and valued by the congregation.
- The team has contemplated many options; and recommends that actions for the future should start with:
 - Focus on ministries, education, and worship which appeal to younger members & families with children
 - Focus on communication (e.g. social media, website, electronic messaging) and outreach
- The team will continue to collect inputs from staff, ministry teams, and congregation members.

Eugene Peterson is best known for THE MESSAGE, his translation of the Bible, but he has written numerous other books. LIVING THE MESSAGE 242 Pet is one of them. The subtitle is "Daily Help for Living the God-Centered Life."

Most devotionals will give the scripture reference at the beginning but interestingly Peterson put the scriptural reference at the end of each of these daily devotions and so it's a surprise sometimes to discover what passage he was using.

Early in February there were several reflections on Psalm 46. Two great commands are seen in this psalm according to Peterson. "Come behold the works of the Lord" is to the author a command to take a "long scrutinizing look at what God is doing". The second instruction is to "Be Still and Know That I Am God" which says Peterson is "quit rushing ...long enough to become aware....."

The daily devotions are compelling enough that you might want to check the book out for the whole year.

Endowment

The next meeting of the Trinity Endowment Committee will be on Thursday, April 19, 2018. All grant requests for this quarterly meeting need to be in the church office two weeks prior to our meeting or by April 5th. This provides adequate time to organize the agenda, seek additional information if needed, and distribute the information to the membership.

All TLC members in good standing are eligible for a \$1,000 scholarship toward expenses related to any higher, continuing education program. An application should be submitted after completion of at least 12 credit hours with a GPA of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale, or provide evidence of satisfactorily completing the course work submitted at a passing level. There is an option to reapply one time for another \$1,000 grant during a separate academic year as long as students still meet the above listed standards. (for a total award of \$2,000 per student)"

In addition to the Scholarships category, the other three categories are Community Outreach, Missions of the ELCA, and Trinity Church Special Causes. Each category is allotted 25% of our total funds for the year. The Trinity Investment Committee has allotted us \$46,162 for awards in the 2018 calendar year.

The Endowment Committee is comprised of six Trinity members, the Council Treasure, and the Senior Pastor. A member may serve two consecutive three-year terms. Any Trinity members who may wish to serve or nominate a candidate should submit that name or names to the Endowment Chair.

Terracycle Update

As we enter our 5th year of Terracycling at Trinity I want to again say Thank You to everyone who has been recycling their “non-recyclables” through Terracycle. Here’s the latest update on what we have diverted from the landfill over the past 4 years:

32 Tom’s of Maine/Colgate Oral Care Brigade shipments with the following totals:

1,752 tubes of toothpaste

1,030 toothbrushes

690 deodorant containers

413 floss containers

170 mouthwash bottles and lids

Innumerable soap and toothbrush packaging

Total poundage for these brigades: **225 lbs**

146 lbs of glue sticks and bottles

Over 50 Brita/Pur water filters/dispensers

116 lbs of individualized snack packaging for the Go-Go Squeeze Brigade

145 lbs of writing instruments/office supplies

391 lbs of hair/skin/cosmetic packaging for the Personal Health and Beauty Brigade

60 lbs of drink pouches for the Drink Pouch Brigade

13 lbs of energy/granola bar wrappers for the Energy Bar Brigade

90 lbs of cereal bags for the Malto-Meal Cereal Bag Brigade

30 lbs of cleaner packaging for the Cleaner Packaging Brigade

Our Zero-Waste coffee bag box is just about full and we now have Zero-Waste boxes for alkaline batteries, gift/key/credit cards and office supplies. And don’t forget to bring in your eclipse glasses – we have a place to send those to be reused/recycled, too. Blood Pressure Guidelines: What your reading means.....

Blood pressure readings fall into four categories, ranging from normal to stage 2 high blood pressure or hypertension. The level of your reading determines what kind of treatment you may need. To get an accurate blood pressure measurement, your doctor or person who is assessing should evaluate your readings based on the average of two and preferably more, readings.

The top number (systolic) or the first number that is said or written is Systolic reading. The systolic number reflects the pressure in your arteries during contraction of your heart muscle. The second number (diastolic) is your Diastolic reading. The diastolic number reflects the heart muscle between beats. New guidelines have recently been released by the American Heart Association, if your reading is 130/80, you are considered to have stage 1 hypertension. Again this should be evaluated at more than one visit and 2+ readings.

Discuss with your physician or health coach, parish nurse healthy lifestyle changes and eating habits that may prevent problems. Your goal should always be to prevent the onset of chronic health conditions. If the doctor prescribes blood pressure medication, it isn't the end of the world....controlling and maintaining a healthy blood pressure helps prevent Many future potential problems or life threatening complications of having an uncontrolled blood pressure.

As I have mentioned several times, being repetitive, I say again....Take care of Yourself, You are worth it!!! Find time to relax and have some down time to enjoy a hobby or an interest.

Best to call, to make sure I am in the office, or call and we'll schedule a time...but I am available often to assess blood pressures or if there is enough interest shown, we can reinstate 1 x month blood pressure check Sundays during fellowship.
